Here are some ideas to engage the entire school community around the Super Recyclers.

To make the clothing drive **more dynamic, visible, and motivating for students**, we suggest using interactive posters displayed at the school entrance, in a central high-traffic area, or in classrooms, as a natural extension of the Super Recyclers' workshop. These visuals allow students to see the impact of their actions and actively participate in the success of the clothing drive.

Each idea presented below can be adapted, whether students choose to bring a bag of clothing to school or simply to show their commitment to the planet. The goal remains the same: to grow student engagement and raise awareness. These visuals transform the clothing drive event into a participatory, educational, and unifying experience for the entire school.

1. The Giant T-Shirt Comes to Life

A large T-shirt is displayed on the wall, divided into sections shaped like clothing bags.

How it works:

Each bag of clothing collected corresponds to one section coloured by a student. As the days go by, the T-shirt fills with colour. At the end of the clothing drive, the school reveals a collective artwork created by the students.

Educational goal:

To show that every individual action contributes to something bigger.



2. The Clothing Drive Tree

A black-and-white tree is displayed without leaves at the start of the clothing drive.

How it works:

Each donation allows a leaf or a piece of clothing to be added to the tree. The tree becomes more vibrant as participation increases. Milestones can be added on the trunk to track progress.

Educational goal:

To illustrate that donations help grow both the planet and the community.



3. We Love Our Planet

In our school, every action counts.

This large heart represents the collective commitment of all students to protect the planet. With every action — donating clothing, repairing, reusing, or talking about it at home — a new heart is added, growing our impact.

How it works:

– Each student writes or colours a small heart with an eco-friendly action:

- repair a piece of clothing
- donate clothing or give it to a friend
- buy less
- reuse
- talk about the Super Recyclers at home

– Actions are displayed as hearts, footprints, or commitment bubbles.

– The wall gradually fills up and becomes a living portrait of the school's engagement.

Educational goal:

To highlight that every action matters — even without a material donation — and to empower all students to make a difference.
